# Protocol for Queensland Government agencies with employees entering Western Queensland

### 1. Purpose


1.1. This Protocol is designed to help provide assurance to communities in Western Queensland that Queensland Government employees are committed to slowing the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) by undertaking certain measures when entering or returning to the Western Queensland Local Government Area.

# 2. Scope and Application

- 2.1 This Protocol applies to all Queensland Government employees entering the Western Queensland Local Government Area to work and/or reside, except for those exempt under Section 4.
- 2.2. This Protocol will apply until the end of the declared public health emergency, unless it is revoked or replaced.

2.2 The Western Queensland Local Government Area is defined as the following local government areas:

- Balonne
- Barcaldine
- Barcoo
- Blackall-Tambo
- Boulia
- Bulloo
- Burke
- Carpentaria
- Cloncurry
- Diamantina
- Doomadgee
- Flinders
- Longreach
- Maranoa
- McKinlav
- Mount Isa

- Paroo
- Quilpie
- Richmond
- Winton.



- 2.2 For the purposes of this Protocol, a Queensland Government employee means:
  - public service employees as defined in s9 of the Public Service Act 2008, including casual employees, chief executives, senior executives and senior officers;
  - · employees of Government-owned entities; and



 a contractor (but not a consultant) as defined in the Department of Housing and Public Work's *Procurement Guidance: Engaging and managing contractors and* consultants, which is available at <a href="https://www.hpw.qld.gov.au/">https://www.hpw.qld.gov.au/</a> data/assets/pdf file/0017/3347/procurementguideeng agingconsultantscontractors.pdf.

Note: a Queensland Government employee does not include staff of non-governmental organisations, even if that organisation receives state funding.

2.3 This Protocol does not override any other requirement, such as any relevant Health Directives, which may apply to a Queensland Government employee entering or residing in Queensland. This includes measures such as social distancing.

Note: Separate restrictions apply in remote Indigenous communities under the Federal *Biosecurity Act 2015* (Cth) declarations. Where both restrictions apply to a community, such as the Burke Shire Council, the *Biosecurity Act 2015* (Cth) declarations prevail. For more information on those restrictions go

- 3 What is required of Queensland Government agencies and Governmentowned entities that have employees entering Western Queensland?
  - 3.1 To protect residents of Western Queensland communities from the effects of COVID-19, Queensland Government agencies and Government-owned entities will ensure their employees entering the Western Queensland Local Government Area:
    - do not have COVID-19 related signs or symptoms immediately before entry (see section 3.2); AND
    - have had no close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case (without appropriate personal protection); AND
    - have not travelled interstate, overseas or to a COVID-19 hotspot in the last 14 days (including disembarkation from a cruise ship).
  - 3.2 Prior to entry into Western Queensland
    - 3.2.1 Employers will arrange for their employees to be screened prior to entry and will not be allowed to enter the designated area if they present with the following symptoms:
      - a fever of 38 degrees or above;
      - a history of fever (including symptoms of a fever such as night sweats or chills); or
      - symptoms of acute respiratory infection (including shortness of breath, a cough, sore throat and/or fatigue).
    - 3.2.2 This screening will be undertaken by a health practitioner, nominated by the employer. Following the screening, the health practitioner will issue a certificate of assessment. The employee will need to submit this certificate, along with a completed questionnaire, to their employer.



## 4 Exemptions

- 4.1 Exemptions to this Protocol include:
  - 4.2.1 Emergency workers, law enforcement officers, judges, magistrates or critical utility, infrastructure or service workers who are required as part of their duties to enter the Western Queensland Local Government Area
  - 4.2.2 Queensland Government employees undertaking duties for the transportation of essential goods or freight, including food
  - 4.2.3 Queensland Government employees transiting or completing a journey through the Western Queensland Local Government Area.

Any other Queensland Government employee, or class of Queensland Government employee, may be exempted by the Chief Health Officer because they determine:

- 4.2.4 they have compassionate or other grounds such that exclusion from the Western Queensland Local Government Areas would lead to an unusual or disproportionate hardship; or
- 4.2.5 they are essential for the proper functioning of the Western Queensland Local Government Area; or
- 4.2.6 other exceptional circumstances exist that merit the person being granted access to Western Queensland Local Government Area.
