- 2. Hold Fellowship of the RACGP (FRACGP) or the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM)
- 3. Have at least five years' full-time or equivalent part-time experience as a vocationally registered GP
- 4. Work at least two sessions a week in face-to-face patient contact in an accredited general practice, and have done so for the last two years
- 5. Have worked at least two sessions a week in face-to-face patient contact in an accredited general practice within the last two years
- 6. Satisfy the relevant college's requirements for their continuing professional development (CPD) program.

All applicants are also required to:

- 1. Possess and maintain a current Working with Children and Working with Vulnerable Persons Checks as required by the state or territory departments/regulators in the state where you reside
- 2. Be in possession of a Positive Notice (satisfactory completion of National Police Check) that has been issued within the last three years
- 3. Have you completed surveyor training under the National General practice Accreditation Scheme in the past?
- 4. Undertake Global-Mark auditor training course and the Commission mandatory training modules.
