Aim of Activity *

To pilot a nurse led in reach wound management clinic for Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACFs) across the Gold Coast region. With the aim to improve outcomes for people with chronic and complex wounds who are living in RACFs.

Description of Activity *

The nurse led in reach program will provide access to specialist wound advice and mentoring that supports the effective assessment, care plan development and management for these patients in their usual place of residence, the RACF, with the aim of reducing the requirement to transfer residents to hospital for clinical interventions. The program includes:

- Development of service delivery model in partnership with industry expert group
- Development of patient-centred wound assessment and management plans
- Coordination of care across the residents usual General Practitioner, RACF staff and other treating clinicans including a local GP with special interest in wound care and hospital specialist services.
- On-site mentoring and coaching of staff to embed best practice within specific RACF environment.
- Support via telephone and secure elctronic messaging.
- Development of a local care pathway, standardised guidelines, informaiton and resources.

An expert reference group has and will continue to inform the program.
