Nearly one million COVID-19 vaccines given by Gold Coast primary care during the pandemic

Over 890,000 COVID-19 vaccinations have been administered in the Gold Coast region since February 2021 through the dedicated efforts of 272 general practices and other health care services.

With the inclusion of vaccines administered through GP-run respiratory clinics, pharmacies, and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations (ACCHOs), primary care has delivered almost one million COVID-19 vaccines in the region since the start of the vaccine rollout in February last year.

GCPHN Chair and GP Dr Roger Halliwell said: "General practices managed increasing demand by opening after hours, on weekends, and using telehealth where clinically appropriate.

"General practices had to be flexible and adapt to constant changes during the pandemic. This was to ensure continuity of service for patients.

"GPs play a vital role in saving lives and protecting the health of our communities, and I would like to thank them for everything they've done during the pandemic."

The Gold Coast's successful vaccine roll-out was a collective response from GPs, Gold Coast Primary Health Network (GCPHN), the Gold Coast Hospital and Health Service, GP respiratory clinics, ACCHOs, and the community.

GCPHN Chief Executive Officer Matt Carrodus said: "In addition to managing an increase in everyday services, the health sector responded swiftly and effectively to the demands of the pandemic.

"GPs, practice managers, practice nurses, administrative staff, receptionists, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workers, all played a critical role during the COVID-19 pandemic response.

"Our analysis shows the leadership role taken, and volume of activity delivered, by general practices and ACCHOs during the pandemic."



Data for the GCPHN region shows the COVID-19 vaccine job is not yet done, with parts of the community still registering low rates of vaccination. For example, only 21% of children aged 5 to 11 years have been double vaccinated. And helping the community to get the flu vaccination is an ongoing, important role for primary health care services.

GPs, ACCHOs, and GP-led respiratory clinics continue to deliver COVID-19 vaccinations on a day-to-day basis, in addition to meeting influenza vaccination demands.

Queensland residents over 6 months old can get their flu shot for free until 30 June 2022. Even if you're fit and healthy, call your GP or local pharmacy to book an appointment or book an appointment online with your GP via HotDoc. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples can contact health clinics at Miami, Coomera, and Bilinga.
