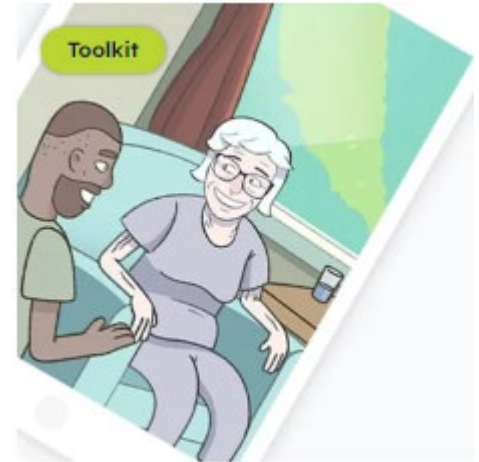

Background to AID approach

- Demand driven – staff lacked confidence to de-escalate critical situations + lack of available training
- Worked with a reference group of experts to adapt an existing approach
- AID approach – Assess, Investigate, Do Something
- Toolkit includes short video about what is the AID approach.
