#### How does it work?

The SMoCC Service is delivered over the phone so you can access it from anywhere in Queensland.

- A Registered Nurse will call you once a month for 4-6 months.
- They will talk to you about how to improve and reduce your health risk factors.
- You and your doctor will receive a letter summarising your session.

## Risk factors your Registered Nurse will help you understand include:

- Blood pressure
- Cholesterol
- Blood glucose levels
- Nutrition
- Physical activity
- Smoking
- Medications

# Is the SMoCC service right for you?

You are eligible if you are over 18, live in Queensland and have been diagnosed with:

- Coronary Artery Disease (angina, heart attack, stent, bypass)
- Type 2 Diabetes
- Pre-Diabetes
- COPD (Emphysema or Chronic Bronchitis)
