Eligibility and vaccines



6 months to less than 5 years

Vaxigrip Tetra® and FluQuadri®

- ALL people aged 6 months to less than 5 years.
- Give two doses at least 4 weeks apart for children aged 6 months to less than 9 years receiving influenza vaccine for the first time.*
- Children should receive a full dose (i.e. not a half dose).

*Note: The National Immunisation Program has experienced a short delay in the supply of Vaxigrip® Tetra. FluQuadri® will be supplied as an alternative influenza vaccine for children aged 6 months to under 5 years until the supply of Vaxigrip® Tetra becomes available. The packaging will not be labelled with "Government Funded Program – 2025".





5 years to less than 65 years

Vaxigrip Tetra® and Flucelvax® Quad

- For people aged 5 years to less than 65 years with medical conditions predisposing them to severe influenza.
- ALL Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 5 years to less than 65 years.
- ALL pregnant people at any stage of pregnancy.
- Give two doses at least 4 weeks apart for children aged 6 months to less than 9 years receiving influenza vaccine for the first time.





65 years and over

Fluad® Quad

- All people aged 65 years and over.
- DO NOT USE THIS VACCINE FOR ANY OTHER AGE GROUP

National Immunisation Program (NIP) funded influenza vaccine should only be administered to NIP eligible persons. For all other Queenslanders regardless of Medicare eligibility, influenza vaccination is free until 30 September 2025 under the Queensland Free Flu Vaccination Program.
