## PRACTICAL WORKSHOP

The purpose of the practical workshops is to provide clinicians with the information, resources and strategies they need to identify, assess, classify, treat and prevent wounds to improve both consumer and health service outcomes. The sessions are open to any RACH or community aged care nurse located within the Gold Coast Primary Health Network region.

## HOW IT WORKS

### Skin Tears

- Learn how to recognise risk factors for skin tears
- Determine how to classify skin tears
- Select treatment options including how to cleanse and reapproximate a skin tear, select and apply appropriate dressings based on assessment of the skin tear
- Identify prevention strategies
- Recognise escalation criteria and/or when to refer (e.g. recurrent infection, full-thickness tissue injury with exposed tendon/muscle or bone, ischaemic wounds, pain and impact on quality of life)
- Engage in interactive discussion

### Incontinence Associated Dermatitis

- Risk factors for IAD
- How to recognise and classify IAD using the GLOBIAD
- Treatment options (e.g. skin cleansing, barrier preparations, signs and symptoms of infection and/or fungal infection, role of pharmacologic therapy)
- Prevention strategies (e.g. skin hygiene, emollients, barrier preparations, environmental temperature, clothing choices, continence management)
