Join us for a special screening of Floodland, a documentary examining Lismore floods, followed by a discussion of the impacts of consecutive disasters on the health and wellbeing of communities.

Set against the backdrop of the devastating 2022 floods in Lismore, NSW, Floodland is a powerful Australian documentary that explores the human impact of climate disaster, resilience, and recovery. Director Jordan Giusti follows a group of local residents as they navigate loss, uncertainty and the difficult decisions that come with rebuilding their lives in one of Australia's most flood-prone communities. Through deeply personal stories, Floodland examines not only the physical destruction left behind by the floods, but also the emotional, cultural and environmental questions facing a town at a crossroads.

Following the screening, Dr Rebecca McNaught will discuss climate change trends in Australia, the impacts of consecutive disasters on the health and wellbeing of communities, community responses to the devastating 2022 floods and how our region is working towards a coordinated approach to community resilience.
