HOW IT WORKS

Skin Tears

- Identify risk factors associated with skin tears
- Complete a holistic assessment of the person to inform the plan of care.
- Recognise factors that may affect wound healing.
- Undertake a focused wound assessment.
- Classify skin tears using an appropriate classification system.
- Select appropriate dressings to manage wound symptoms.
- Develop strategies to prevent future skin tears.
- Apply evidence-based principles to assess and manage both simple and complex skin tears.
- Adapt assessment, management and prevention strategies for more complex lower leg skin tear presentations.

Leg Ulcers

- Identify risk factors associated with venous leg ulcers
- Complete a holistic assessment of the person to inform the plan of care.
- Recognise factors that may affect wound healing.
- Undertake a focused wound assessment.
- Identify characteristics of a venous leg ulcer and methods to perform a non-invasive vascular assessment of the lower limb
- Select appropriate dressings to manage wound symptoms.
